



Learn to Fish

The 'Learn to Fish' course will allow interested students to experience training in the fundamentals of fishing, including gear selection, rigging, baiting a hook, using lures, casting and retrieving and of course, landing a fish. Discussions about fish species, fish conservation and fishing etiquette will also be embedded into the program.

This program will be delivered from the Milson Island Sport and Recreation Centre on the beautiful Hawkesbury River. Students will experience fishing from wharfs, beaches and from boats – allowing exposure to three forms of river fishing. Surrounded by heavily forested hills and steep cliffs, the river offers anglers rich and varied offerings, from sand whiting, bream to flathead and even the ever-elusive mulloway.

Students will be transported from the College to the banks of the Hawkesbury by minibus where they will be collected by boat and transferred to Milson Island. At the conclusion of the program students will be returned to the College for collection. The program will be postponed should there be bad weather.
